

Avoiding discrimination


- Are minority groups represented?
- Are factors and correlations with protected characteristics understood?
- Is systemic discrimination impacting data?
- Are training outcomes biased?
- Knowledge of protected characteristics enables checking





Apple card sparked fair lending investigation


- High profile tweets suggested a gender bias
- Legal investigation cleared apple
- Test only checked for direct discrimination, not proxy discrimination.
- Law hasn't kept up with technology








Professionalism



Beyond the letter of the law - discrimination free pricing

- Unawareness price from model without gender displays indirect discrimination
- Gender effect comes through age proxy (data <50 is mainly female, >60 is mainly male)
- Build a male and a female model, then combine
- Straightforward when gender is known, but gender model could be used to fill in gaps





Mitigating unwanted bias - adversarial models

- First model predicts the variable of interest Y from input data X
- Adversary model predicts the protected characteristic Z, from the first model output Y
- Choose a model to maximise the prediction of Y subject to minimising the ability of the adversary to predict Z





Figure 1: The architecture of the adversarial network.



Legal discrimination – the poverty premium

- 'The average household in poverty pays almost £500 a year extra for essential services such as credit, energy and insurance...'
- '...Vulnerable and low-income consumers can present a higher risk to insurers, due to a range of factors often outside the consumers' control'
- Increasingly personal pricing can lead the more vulnerable in society without cover
- Is it fair? How do you define fair?





Taking responsibility

- Understand limits of generative Al
- Double check everything (material)
- Plagiarism risk
- Transparency

OpenAl's ChatGPT has wowed users with its ability to write essays and speeches, complete homework, crack computer code and pen poems - but it's also prone to completely making things up.







Social dilemmas


A Social dilemma exists whereby:






Different attitudes to ethics – UK vs Russia

Different attitudes to ethics – UK vs France










